Colorful ping-pong balls jumping all over stage, live music that doubles the fun, delightful songs that invite the audience to join in, and breathtaking dances, all come together to release the child's imagery. Every day things that surround the child, such as ping-pong balls, spoons, hair dryers, and umbrellas are used to tell the story, which enhances the child's imagination, introducing them to the magic of theatre.

Artistic Director: Sato Makoto

A pioneer of Japanese contemporary theatre and the Artistic Director of Za-Koenji Public Theatre. His unique plays, written in an imaginary style and sharply critical of society and history, are among the most politically and socially confrontational in the augura period in the Sixties. Sato has directed both Japanese and foreign plays, alongside a wide range of opera, traditional Japanese dance, modern dance, ningyō shibai or string puppet drama, and noh productions.

Director and Set Designer: tupera tupera

tupera tupera is the name of a workshop of Japanese children's illustration book artists founded by the couple, Kameyama Tatsuya and Nakagawa Atsuko. Their illustrations are rich in creativity and humourous and witty in style, with beautiful colours, and their famous works include Polar Bear's Underwear, Kudamonosan, Yasaisan, Boushitottara and Panda Bathing.

Director and Choreographer: Keiko Takeya

Keiko Takeya founded the CDC (Contemporary Dance Company) in 1983, and acts as both choreographer and dancer. Takeya did not adopt the traditional practice of apprenticeship, but lets members of her company to be creative in their participation of the dance pieces, allowing young members to gain practical creative experience, and thus fosters a lot of choreographers and dancers. In the year 2001, she changed the name of the company to DANCE01, and was invited numerously to perform overseas as exchange.
